- by Adam Bly Fiber Optic technicians laying down lines were attacked and robbed by members of the Furnifold Patriotic Front (FPF), according to eyewitness accounts and social media. The

technicians were working on a project sponsored by the Furnifold government to increase Internet access for about 24 percent of the population, and was under contract by a staterun company of Chianski, as well as Oancom Ltd.

The technicians were attacked by people wielding clubs and large stones, and were forced to flee in their trucks. The FPF targeted Kfalme technicians employed by the country. Two sustained several fractures due to the attack. Upon returning with armed security, the technicians found their equipment destroyed. The Department of Justice and Courts has declared the attack a deliberate targeting by ethnicity. The FPF is a militant organization dedicated to removing Kfalme influence and discrimination from their region. Recently their organization has become more active, going after areas in the southwest that are evidently Furnifold government centers, or businesses that are internationally based.




The Times reached out to Oancom Ltd. and the nation of Chianski for statements. Oancom Ltd. stated that the company does not discriminate on the basis of ethnicity, and in addition to condemning the attack by the FPF, are looking for ways to engage with the communities to help alleviate tensions of their presence. The nation of Chianski did not respond for comment. According to government sources, the telecommunications contract is upwards of 300 million SHD and mainly benefits people living in the southwest. 

Analysis: The market continues its positive growth after falling last month, and currently it is the highest it has ever been. Up a great deal is okra, which has recovered since the beginning of the month. Soy also returned to its May 1st level, prompting confidence again in its sale. The big loser was sugar cane, which hit its lowest level since the IPO. Sugar cane has always been an unstable commodity in Furnifold, and this may prompt discussions in the Department of Finance and Economy to remove it from the index. The replacement would likely be milk, which has seen a meteoric rise since its IPO, rising 300 percent since late March. If sugar cane falters, investors may clamor the Department to replace the commodity with milk.

Men curious about London in bygene times and London as it is have been pleased with the discovery of a document which fixes the gar in which that fine row of forcest trees, now the leading comment. of Piccadilly, was planted. The trees were planted in the year 1780, by Lord William Gordon, then Deputy Ranger of the Greenpark, to whom King George HL granted the right of inclosing for his own use that piece of ground once so familiar to every west-cald man. Grant interest was made for the destruction of these trees as soon as they were planted. Lord William, it appears from this newly-discovered document, designed a further plantation along Piccadilly; whereapan the Dake of Queenderry (old Q.) and the Marquis of Cholmondeley, with the Piccadilly inhabitants over against Lord William's lodge, memorialised the King to forbid any further plantation, and to direct the removal of the trees planted. Thus King let the trees stand, but forbade the planting of others opposite old Q.'s and the Marquis of Cholmondeley's. This curious document is accompanied by a plan of the park and of the bauses finding the trees in Forcadilly. What is now the Dahenes of Glouester's was in 1780 the Marquis of Cholmondeley's.
